Dear Mr. Castleman,

We spoke several months ago about the documentation I have showing what may be embezzlement by the members of the Board of Trustees of Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church, in collusion with Vornado Real Estate Trust VP Sandeep Mathrani and The Presbytery of New York City, among others.

On or about January 18 I received a telephone call from Ms. Judy Weinstock, the person who you delegated as the investigator in this matter, and she told me that she would not be pursuing any investigation because I "did not give us [the DA's office] a receipt for the New Jersey construction company who did the work on the two toilets."

Ms. Weinstock was referring to the two toilets that cost the church congregation almost \$170,000 but that the work permit showed a payment of \$90,000 to the company that provided the work.

I believe this is an outrage, and I want to know if her actions have anything to do with the fact that District Attorney Robert Morgenthau's youngest daughter is/was a student at The Nightingale Bamford School at 20 East 92nd Street in New York City, with my three oldest daughters? Or, the sudden removal of Admissions Director Carole Everett from her position at the school after I asked for her to account for my daughter's rejection of a seat again, after being a stellar student? As you may know, Carole Everett was moved with her husband and son suddenly out of her job and New York City to St. Croix last year.

Please give me an explanation, in writing for Ms. Weinstock's inappropriate response to my 300+ pages of documentation. If I receive no response, I and the public may conclude that your office is working with the Trustees of both MAPC and Nightingale Bamford to stop any exposure of what I allege is embezzlement and racketeering. Thank you for your consideration.
